We encourage pre-schoolers through to Year 8's, as individuals or as a group, to respond creatively to this theme, as we seek ways to reach out in love and kindness. ### Luke 9:51-62

*Verses 51-56*: Jesus is traveling to Jerusalem and nothing is going to stop him (9:51—19:27). Jerusalem is where he will be killed and where (nearby) he will ascend to heaven. He sends messengers to a Samaritan village, but they will not receive him because he is going to Jerusalem. James and John ask/suggest if they should call fire down on the village (something like 1 Kings 18:38 or 2 Kings 1:10), but Jesus rebukes them and goes to another village.

*Verses 57-62*: A person approaches him and offers/promises to follow Jesus wherever he goes. Jesus announces that he, the Son of Man, has no permanent home. Jesus tells another person to follow him, but this fellow wants to bury his father first. Jesus orders him to let the dead bury the dead. He should go proclaim about God's kingdom. Another person states he will follow Jesus but he must first bid farewell to his family. Jesus announces that deciding to follow him replaces all other obligations.

Joseph A. Fitzmyer summarizes Jesus' interaction with the three would-be disciples: "Thus, the following of Jesus does not simply mean imitation of him, but entering into the very conditions of his life, ministry, and lot. It calls a person to a sacrifice of security (Case I), filial duty (Case II), and family affection (Case III)" (*The Gospel According To Luke 1:834-835*).
